YOU CAN HELP KEEP OUR CREEKS, THE BAY AND DELTA CLEAN!

When working on outdoor projects, remember the following pollution solutions:

-  Only rain should go down the storm drain
-  Don't leave litter on your street where it may be flushed into the storm drain
-  Don't over-water lawns or hose down areas that have just been treated with pesticides or fertilizers
-  Consider washing your car on the lawn and using a water-saving pistol grip nozzle
-  Don't hose down driveways that have oil or antifreeze deposits; use kitty litter instead to absorb the liquids. Collect and dispose of all wastes properly.
